With over three decades of exhaustive experience in all aspects of theatre, starting with stage management at the age of 20, Julian Stoneman is an industry veteran.



DEGREE COURSE OVERVIEW

Our BA (Hons) in Performing Arts offers something unique. Not only will BRICTT training professionals be trained in the disciplines of singing, dancing and acting by tutors of the highest calibre, but they will also study modules in professional and personal development, and will be supported throughout their learning by a robust mental and physical wellbeing programme.

The emphasis then is clear; in order to sustain a career in this business, performers need to be able to work at the highest level, but they also need to be able to take control of that work, know how to market themselves and how to keep themselves mentally and physically resilient. They need to be able to generate work and to sustain themselves artistically when the going gets tough. Alongside the core disciplines, training professionals will develop a range of creative and transferrable skills.

Training professionals will receive up to 30 hours of contact time each week. Small classes and regular individual sessions with tutors, directors, choreographers, casting directors and actors, mean that by the end of their training they will be prepared for the competitive and fast-paced creative arts industry. Over the three years they will also acquire critical and academic skills as they develop into independent, reflective and knowledgeable practitioners with a clear creative vision.

This degree programme has been designed by the industry for the industry, indeed all the tutors and visiting professionals are still active in the business. Training professionals will have their talent nurtured, challenged and developed by experienced staff. Dedicated tutors will support them through academic and critical studies. They will undertake a portfolio of final performances, explore a range of original work and be guided in their preparation for agent interviews and auditions. BRICTT has a wide range of industry connections, which the training professionals will have invaluable access to. The approach will ensure that graduates leave with the necessary attributes to exploit a wide range of employment opportunities, equipping them to succeed in an increasingly competitive profession.

BRICTT will prepare training professionals for entry in to the performing arts industry, it will connect them to current industry practices, it will provide the rigour appropriate for a degree course of this nature. Perhaps, most importantly of all, it will also offer a space for training professionals to find their voice, to gain self-awareness, to build confidence. A space to dance and sing and act because those things are important. Without them the very fabric of our society is threatened.

ACTING TECHNIQUE

by Gary Sefton

In the first year you will develop the ability to work off impulse in the moment, engaging with key acting principles within specific methodologies. You will begin the process of analysing a text and will be encouraged throughout to work with courage and flexibility in your approach.

The second year allows you to embed your training and to develop it as you become more familiar with your own process and how to evaluate your work. You will engage with ideas that move you further from notions of self and become more complex in their demands. You will have the opportunity to work in front of the camera and so develop techniques in acting for film and TV.


In the third year you will continue to develop as you put your training into practice, working with a series of directors on public performances. You will also create your own show reel in this final year, and work on your audition technique, in preparation for entry into the profession.

VOCAL TECHNIQUE

In your first year, you will be looking at the anatomy and physiology of your voice. Studying the Estill method will enable you to build a healthy, reliable and versatile technique that serves you in transitioning seamlessly back and forth between singing and speaking.

As well as 1:1 tutorials, you will experience two ensemble classes in your first year; a contemporary ensemble singing class, working on current musical theatre repertoire and a choral class. These classes will focus upon the core technical skills needed to successfully negotiate your way through a professional music call. They will cover a range of material. In your acting through song class, you will learn to become a truthful story teller, as acting technique begins to inform the delivery of a song.

During your second year you will have the opportunity to consolidate and develop your studies, deepening your knowledge and preparing your voice for performance.


Your final year provides you with the opportunity to put your training into practice. Your voice will be showcased during a range of performances, from studio recordings to fully staged concerts and shows.

During the second year you will apply your learning as training intensifies. As well as honing your own skills, you will work collaboratively, choreographing pieces as you deepen your exploration of dance performance.

The final year is the time to prepare for the profession. You will work with renowned choreographers from television, music videos and stage. You will also engage in major public performances throughout the year.


NATHAN POTTER HEAD OF DANCE

TECHNICAL THEATRE IN PRACTICE MODULE

Technical Theatre in Practice, explores the technical workings of theatre, empowering students to take control of their broader creative identities. Training professionals investigate set and costume design, lighting and sound, the functionality of space as well learning about new technology and its application in contemporary theatre. They develop initiative and take personal responsibility in creative thinking. Understanding the effect of technical theatre on performance will inform the student's approach to acting and expand their creative output.

MARK DAVIES TECHNICAL THEATRE MODULE LEADER



Mark is an experienced short-form director with a successful background in cutting long-form drama for BBC, ITV and Channel Four. Establishing his editing skills

with a mix of high-end flagship television drama; most recently Taboo (BBC1/FX) and Unforgotten (ITV), Peaky Blinders(BBC2/Netflix) and Sherlock (BBC1). He has cut series such as Silk (BBC1), Whitechapel (ITV1), Endeavour (ITV) and Mistresses (BBC1).

He has a diverse CV ranging from the hit comedies Outnumbered and Trollied, to family-friendly programmes such as Dr Who, Robin Hood, Privates, and the Bafta-winning My Life As A Popat. Mark will be running the Technical Theatre unit at BRICTT.



ENTERTAINMENT BUSINESS MODULE

Training Professionals will be taught a module on Business Entertainment. Here they are provided with a detailed understanding of the workings of the performance industry in the UK; exploring how it is structured, the organisational mechanisms of production and the means through which it is financed. Students will be encouraged to develop commercial skills and access input from current practitioners as well as being directly involved in the fringe.

CONNOR BAUM ENTERTAINMENT BUSINESS MODULE & FRINGE COORDINATOR



Having trained at Rose Bruford College and Columbia College Chicago (where he was awarded Outstanding Achievement in Directing) Conor Baum was

offered a directing observership with California-based repertory company Shakespeare Napa Valley in collaboration with the University of Kingston and SITI Theatre Company New York. Conor went on to work for The Wrestling School under Howard Barker and for the Royal Shakespeare Company.

OUR COLLABORATION WITH THE FRINGE

The Brighton Fringe Festival is the largest arts festival in England drawing in several thousand acts per year to over 40 different venues around the city. BRICTT has an exclusive relationship with the festival, which gives the students allotted time throughout to demonstrate the skills they have learnt and to expand on ideas they have been exploring. This provides students with a platform to create a production from scratch and to learn from the audience's response to it.

HOW TO APPLY VIA UCAS

You can apply to study BRICTT's BA (Hons) in Performing Arts by requesting an audition. To do so please call our Admissions Team on 01273 603 333 or go to brictt.co.uk/apply.

To finalise your application through UCAS you will need to go to ucas.com. You will need to register on UCAS before you can submit any choices.

To make an application through UCAS you will need to go to www.ucas.com. You will need to register on UCAS before you can submit any choices. There are many helpful guides on the UCAS website. We encourage you to use these guides if you are experiencing any difficulties.

Once we receive your enquiry, you'll need to attend BRICTT for an audition workshop. This will be an opportunity for you to work with industry professionals and showcase your skills and, if successful, you may be re-called for a second audition.

We're committed to equal opportunities and widening participation, and work to create significant opportunities for people of all ages and backgrounds.

FEES, FINANCE AND LOANS

Performing Arts, Stage and Drama Schools often charge fees of up to £15,000 per year. But at BRICTT, we are uniquely positioned to offer outstanding quality and value to our training professionals.

This means that our undergraduate three year BA (Hons) in Performing Arts degree course is priced at £9,000 per annum for UK and EU students. If eligible, applicants can apply to the Student Loan Company (SLC) to cover £6,165* of the tuition fees payable every year. You may also be entitled to subsistence, which will help to cover living costs.

For applicants to be eligible for SLC funding they must be studying a designated course. Courses at BRICTT are designated each year by the Department for Education. We've made an application for our BA (Hons) course to be designated for the 2018/19 academic year and we expect this process to be completed in early 2018. For more information, please visit hefce.ac.uk/reg/desig/cdforstudents.

For 2018/19, the remaining £2,835 will need to be paid by the applicant. We ask for a £500 deposit on accepting the offer of a place, and are happy to implement monthly payment plans throughout the academic year to meet the balance of £2335. Please be aware, however, that student funding for courses is not available to everyone, so it's worth checking if you're eligible before applying for your course.

EU applicants may be able to get a student loan to cover tuition costs. If you're from the EU, information about how to apply can be found at direct.gov.uk/studentfinance (please select 'students from other EU countries').

Please note, those from countries within the European Economic Area (EEA) and not from a country formally within the European Union (EU) will not be eligible for application.

Please be advised that a minimum level of essential equipment is required to start your studies with BRICTT. For more information, please contact the BRICTT Admissions Team on 01273 603 333 or email bricttadmissions@brictt.co.uk.

REPAYMENTS

Your loan repayments are linked to your income. You only make repayments when your income is above £21,000 a year and if your income drops below this amount, repayments stop. Each month you pay back 9% of any income over £21,000 - this would work at approximately £30 per month if you're earning £25,000 per year.

As a student city, Brighton has a whole host of great accommodation options, as well as a good public transport system with excellent links to London, and the ability to get around easily without a car.


BRICTT is based in central Brighton, meaning wherever you choose to live, your journey will be direct and straightforward.
